The apartment buildings will be wheelchair-accessible and have potential for being financed using Green Bonds. A total of 172 apartments ranging between 70 and 150 square metres in size will be built for different generations. The urban pressure in Utrecht also ensures long-term demand on the housing market.

Hof van Tuindorp will be designed in a life-course-resistant manner. In other words, they will be suitable for the young and the old, and for people with or without a need for assistance. If necessary, home care packages will be available through care partner Careyn.
